Evaluation Methods Used: The main testing tools and methods used were WAVE (Web Accessibility Evaluation Tool) from WebAIM, Colour Contrast Analyser (CCA), JAWS (Job Access With Speech) screen reader from Freedom Scientific, the NVDA screen reader, an Apple iPad for mobile and manual keyboard testing. The browsers used were Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, and Microsoft Edge.
