Evaluation Methods Used: The main testing tools and methods used were WAVE (Web Accessibility Evaluation Tool) from WebAIM, Colour Contrast Analyser (CCA), the IBM Equal Access Accessibility Checker, ARC Toolkit, JAWS (Job Access With Speech) screen reader from Freedom Scientific, NVDA screen reader, an Apple iPad for mobile and manual keyboard testing. The browsers used were Google Chrome and Microsoft Edge.
